Last year the number of people displaced rose to more than 70 million and natural disasters such as Cyclone Idai in East Africa, and ongoing conflicts in Syria and Yemen, threatened the safety, stability and health of millions.

We're striving more than ever to harness new partnerships, innovations, technology, ideas and improved ways of working to positively affect more people in the places where we work. This past year we reached nearly 29 million people; a scale greater than any time in our history. Underpinning much of our work is a commitment to building the resilience of communities in the face of shocks and stresses, more urgent than ever as we scale-up our response to the climate crisis.

Empathy and compassion – qualities our global team of humanitarians stand for – have never been more needed. I want to express my deepest appreciation to all who have contributed to our work around the world this year.

Your support is helping young people, like Olga in Guatemala, unlock opportunities to become small-business owners and take the next step towards financial security. It's connecting refugee children to the resources they need to heal from trauma. And it's supporting communities as they prepare for, and rebuild after, natural disasters.

Thanks to your support, in 2019 we:

- Reached nearly 29 million people in more than 40 countries
- Responded to major crises in The Bahamas, Bangladesh, Colombia, India, Nepal, Myanmar and Zimbabwe, delivering key resources like first aid, water, sanitation facilities, solar lanterns and long-term recovery support
- Partnered with leading newspaper The Times to raise over £438,000 to help those on the frontlines of the humanitarian crisis in Yemen (some of which was match-funded by The TripAdvisor Charitable Foundation)

OPENING UP OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

When young people are in crisis, their entire community's future is at stake.

Today's young people face a unique set of challenges; from high unemployment, to recovering from conflict, to being the first generation to grow up with the tangible effects of the climate crisis.

In 2019, your support helped us to connect hundreds of thousands of young people with resources to build their own businesses, safe spaces as they recover from crisis, and the opportunity to become leaders as they work to transform their communities for good.

Reaching new heights

In Gaza, jobs are scarce and often pay far too little for the skills they require. We're helping young people create their own promising opportunities through Gaza Sky Geeks, a Mercy Corps tech incubator project that's helped over 2,000 young people like Anas start small tech businesses.



Anas is now selfemployed as a medical translator, with plans to use the money he's earned to study psychiatry in the U.K.



Breaking through barriers

Access to an education is a gamechanger, but a lack of resources keeps too many girls and young women out of the classroom. In 2019, we connected tens of thousands of girls and young women around the world to the supplies and support they need. In Ethiopia, we helped girls like Rahima get textbooks, uniforms and tuition.

Today, Rahima is working towards her master's degree so she can become a maths teacher and help other girls and young women in her community pursue the education they deserve.

MAKING MATCHES FOR OPPORTUNITY

Through funding from Google.org, Youth Impact Labs supports technologies like job-matching platforms, which helped 5,674 participants across the Middle East and Africa find work in 2019

RESPONDING AND REBUILDING AFTER EMERGENCIES

When disaster strikes and crisis unfolds, our global team of humanitarians mobilises to save lives.

The world's toughest crises can destroy lives and debilitate the support systems needed for recovery. That's why we're on the ground before, during and long after devastating events, ready to help communities meet their most urgent needs and rebuild stronger for the future.

With your help, in 2019 we stood alongside communities facing conflict, disaster and disease. In Zimbabwe, the Democratic Republic of Congo and The Bahamas, we were there with support, providing vital resources and training to help people recover and prepare for the challenges ahead.

On the frontlines of relief

Mercy Corps was among the first to respond after Cyclone Idai devastated Ngangu, Zimbabwe. We provided more than 26,000 emergency kits to communities that had been badly affected by wind, rain and multiple mudslides.



Partnering for recovery

One of the most powerful Atlantic storms on record, Hurricane Dorian hovered over The Bahamas for 48 hours, destroying homes, levelling airports and contaminating fresh water.

Mercy Corps and Mission Resolve Foundation joined forces to build a water treatment plant, whic provided over 28,000 litres of fresh water to residents every day.

Taking on an outbreak with outreach

Last year, we launched our Vision Ebola Zero programme in the Democratic Republic of Congo as the country grappled with the world's second-worst Ebola outbreak. Despite rising distrust of medical aid, we reached over 1 million people with lifesaving information — including hygiene techniques like handwashing — to reduce infection rates.

TAPPING A NEW WATER SOURCE

Treating locally sourced water through reverse osmosis makes it suitable for drinking, cooking and bathing. It also decreases plastic waste and frees up valuable space on vehicles delivering aid.

ADAPTING TO THE RISING CLIMATE CRISIS

As our planet's weather patterns change, more droughts, floods and natural disasters are affecting already fragile communities.

The challenges that the world's most vulnerable communities already face are now being compounded by rising food insecurity, resource-related conflict and disappearing livelihoods. It's becoming more difficult for people to find a path forward.

Your support has been essential in opening up new possibilities. Through technology, we're developing innovative ways to connect communities to crucial information, resources and solutions. By helping people adapt to the challenges that climate change poses, we're helping them to build better lives for themselves and their families.



Transforming agriculture through technology

In Kenya, agricultural communities rely on the rainy season. Increased drought is putting small-scale farmers like Lydia and her husband at risk of losing their livelihoods. With Mercy Corps' AgriFin programme, Lydia planted sunflower seeds and was able to buy a goat with her profits. Through mobile phones, AgriFin connects farmers to high-quality seeds, as well as crop insurance, financial tools, weather data, soil testing and a host of other resources that help them adapt to the impacts of a changing climate.



Cultivating more secure lives

In Myanmar, extended droughts are becoming more frequent. Growing consistent, high-yield crops is becoming increasingly difficult for farmers like Lal.

To help, Mercy Corps' weather-index insurance programme is expanding to reach at least 5,000 acres of paddy farms, so farmers' investments won't be completely lost in the event of future droughts.

BETTER DATA FOR A BETTER WORLD

Through a partnership with NASA, our AgriFin programme is growing. Soon, farmers will have access to an expanded set of digital tools, which will harness the power of satellite data to help them manage their crops and adapt to climate change.

OUR WORLD IS BRIGHTER WHEN WE WORK TOGETHER

What we achieved together in 2019 helped build a better world for millions of people. With your support, our work has made an impact and continues to open up new opportunities for the future.

UNLOCKING EDUCATION EQUALITY

We're creating better opportunities for more than 6,000 girls in Nepal.

In the Kailali district of Nepal, attitudes surrounding gender roles shape how much support many girls receive in their education. By reaching out to parents, Mercy Corps has helped underserved girls focus on homework instead of housework. They're making strides in literacy and maths, and clearing the way to more job opportunities after graduation.

Girls like Sabita benefit from programmes that change the way parents think about education for girls.



A PATH FORWARD FOR THOSE FAR FROM HOME

We've delivered emergency cash, medicine and other support to nearly 10,000 Venezuelan migrants and refugees fleeing to Colombia.

In 2019, political unrest and inflation forced more than 1 million Venezuelans to seek safety and security in Colombia. Jose and Ana Maria have found work and shelter, but providing for their family is still difficult. Emergency cash from Mercy Corps helped them to buy essential supplies, and get the medical care they needed to welcome their new baby.





PROTECTING RESOURCES AND LIVELIHOODS

We helped over 260,000 households in Ethiopia build resilience to climate change.

As droughts worsen in Ethiopia, natural resources are vanishing, and farmers and ranchers are at risk of losing their livelihoods. Cattle ranchers Gale and Tutu worked

with Mercy Corps to form a farmers group that is helping their community protect the land, adapt to extreme weather and survive the dry season.



STRENGTHENING SOLIDARITY AMONG REFUGEE GIRLS

We're helping girls and young women establish support networks after fleeing violence.

As they build new lives in new countries, it's important that Syrian refugees — especially children and young people — have what they need to succeed. As a part of our ongoing work to provide support to refugee youth, we launched the WISE Girls programme, which empowers girls and young women to express themselves and lead classes on reproductive health.

Persistence through conflict and crisis

In addition to our work with Syrian refugees and their host communities, in 2019 we provided immediate emergency support for **over 630,000 people in Syria** amid rising violence inside the country.
